Commentators in this movie describe the Vermont Anti-Racism Action Team; Reading to End Racism; Anti-Racism Study Circles; the community movie screenings with facilitated discussions of “Living on the Fault Line: Where Race and Family Meet;” and the ALANA Community Organization based in Brattleboro, Vermont, serving the entire state.

Special comments.

The information about Jeff Farber’s screenings with the Children’s Aid Society are timely Summer 2008, but will be “dated” once he has finished touring around the state. After that, churches can still benefit from hearing about the film, and deciding whether to sign the movie out of the resource center and do their own screening.

For churches: This is convenient packaging of more detailed information about these programs than what could be included in the ½ - hour “Vermont, a Multiracial, Multicultural State?”

For broadcasters: This length movie complements the 47-minute interview with Pajj Wadley-Bailey; can be stopped anytime after 00:12:16. (Remaining footage gives additional contact information and copyright information.)

For trainers: Specific programs can be conveniently located by chapter markers.
