(Gen 4:9)

On the way into work this morning I heard an old gospelly/bluegrass song entitled "Me and Jesus Got Our Own Thing Going." As the title implies, this is a song about needing nothing and no one because of the singer's personal relationship with Jesus.

River of Life Pilgrimage on the Connecticut River: May 31-July 9

The River of Life Pilgrimage, which was announced at Annual Meeting, will launch today, May 31, and proceed down the Connecticut River for the next forty days. This exciting venture in watershed awareness, spirituality and stewardship is sponsored by the NH and VT Diocese of the Episcopal Church, and welcomes people of all faiths to participate. Water is central to life, and living, flowing rivers have played an integral role in ecological, social, economic and spiritual practice worldwide since time immemorial. The Connecticut River is a prime example of a river carrying the lifeblood of a region. Here are several ways you and/or your congregation can participate:

1. Join the Pilgrimage for one of the segments of the trip, (register on the web-site) or for one of several one-day shorter sections of the trip (registration not necessary, though suggested.)
2. Participate in some of the activities along the shore, especially each weekend at hub locations in the Upper Valley (June 16-18) and Brattleboro (June 25) - see web-site for details.
3. Incorporate the pilgrimage into your Sunday worship, or your personal devotions, by including prayers or readings from the "River of Life Prayer Book" which can be downloaded from the

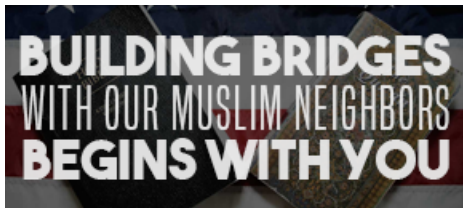

Who is Jesus for Muslims?

"According to Islam, Jesus always speaks the truth. The question is how we understand it."

Amy Frykholm interviews Zeki Saritoprak

Zeki Saritoprak's book *Islam's Jesus* examines the role of Jesus in the Qur'an and in Islamic theology. He has written about many Islamic theologians, mystics, and scholars, including the 13th-century poet and Sufi mystic Rumi and the early 20th-century Turkish Muslim scholar Bedi'üzzaman Said Nursi. A professor of Islamic studies at John Carroll University in University Heights, Ohio, he has been involved in interfaith dialogues, including the Catholic-Muslim dialogues cosponsored by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Islamic Society of North America. His book *Islamic Spirituality: Theology and Practice for the Modern World* will be published in November.

Who is Jesus in Islam?

In Islam, Jesus, peace and blessings be upon him, is one of the five greatest messengers of God who are collectively known as the 'Ul al-Azm or the Possessors of Steadfastness. Jesus is also a real person who lived in Roman Judea in the first century of the Common Era. Muslims share with Christians most of the basic outlines of Jesus' story, though there are certainly differences. In Islam, as well as in Christianity, Jesus was born to the Virgin Mary and was without a father. But for Muslims, Jesus is neither God nor the Son of God.
