



27 color, migrant communities, deindustrialized communities, depopulated rural communities, the poor,  
28 low income workers, women, the elderly, the unhoused, people with disabilities, and youth.” Indeed, the  
29 genius of the resolution is that it identifies and seeks to address two interrelated crises: a climate crisis  
30 and a socio-economic crisis of wage stagnation and growing inequality.

31 In compliance with the Standing Rules of General Synod, this resolution is submitted as a so-  
32 called Emergency Resolution because the Congressional Resolution itself (H. Res. 109) was not released  
33 until February 7, 2019, well past the January 2, 2019, deadline for Standard Resolutions.

### 36 **BIBLICAL, THEOLOGICAL AND ETHICAL RATIONALE**

#### 37 **Amos 5:24 (NRSV)**

38 <sup>24</sup> ... *let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.*

41 <sup>1</sup> *The earth is the LORD's and all that is in it*

45

46 As people of faith, we recognize that ***the earth is the Lord's***... Nevertheless, Creation, God's great gift  
47 – the context in which all life seeks fulfillment – is in crisis. The scientific consensus is unambiguous.  
48 Climate change is real, it's caused by human activity, it's already happening, and it's accelerating. The  
49 scale of Creation's demise is dramatically expanding beyond our comprehension.

50

51 The Green New Deal addresses this urgent crisis by offering America a comprehensive vision that, if  
52 implemented, can save millions of lives even as it addresses economic inequalities, environmental  
53 racism and other manifestations of climate injustice.

54

55 Our generation still has the power to bend the moral arc of the universe towards justice by reviving  
56 creation. Indeed, by acting with the urgency and on the scale of the Green New Deal, we may still have  
57 time to avoid the worst consequences of climate change as we seek to preserve God's great gift of  
58 creation.

61 **TEXT OF THE MOTION**

62 WHEREAS, the Green New Deal is rooted in the scientific findings from the October 2018 [Special](#)  
63 [Report from the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change](#), which declares that carbon emissions  
64 must be reduced by about fifty per cent before 2030 and completely phased out before 2050 if global  
65 temperature rise is to be limited to 1.5°Celsius;<sup>3</sup>

66

67 WHEREAS, humanity is already contending with changes on a scale we can hardly comprehend, such  
68 as:

- 69 • Rainfall from big storms is now measured in feet - not inches (e.g., Houston received five feet  
70 (61") of rain from Hurricane Harvey).<sup>4</sup>
- 71 • The Earth's temperature is already well into the range that existed during the Eemian period,  
72 120,000 years ago, when sea level was 20 to 30 feet higher than it is now.<sup>5</sup>

- 73 • The cost of catastrophic, unprecedented flooding in the Midwest in the spring of 2019 is well  
74 over \$3 billion.<sup>6</sup>
- 75 • “Not since World War II have more human beings been at risk from disease and starvation than  
76 at this very moment.” Climate change is the primary cause of droughts, which are increasingly  
77 rendering areas in Africa uninhabitable.<sup>7</sup>
- 78 • Recognizing that the sixth mass extinction in geological history is now underway, biologists are  
79 using the term “Biological Annihilation” as species are going extinct at at least 100 times the  
80 normal rate;<sup>8</sup>

81 WHEREAS, the urgency of the climate crisis is accelerating faster than anyone imagined. For example:

- 82 • In January, 2019, scientists learned that the oceans are warming 40% faster than they had  
83 previously thought.<sup>9</sup>
- 84 • As the oceans absorb CO<sub>2</sub>, they are becoming more acidic at a frightening rate in excess of any  
85 change the world has seen in 300 million years;<sup>10</sup>

86

87 WHEREAS, climate change multiplies and accelerates injustice by hitting the poorest people and people  
88 of color first and worst because it’s the poorest people and people of color who typically live in areas

89 most likely to flood, most prone to disease, and most subject to the droughts, heat-waves and various  
90 diseases that are now migrating on account of climate change.

91

92 WHEREAS, climate change is creating and accelerating a health crisis in our inner cities that gets worse  
93 each summer, especially as rising temperatures create urban heat islands responsible for more and more  
94 cases of asthma that are disabling – and killing – children and elderly people of color.

95

96 WHEREAS, those most affected by climate change have not caused it and are powerless to stop it. For  
97 example, the farmers in parts of Africa who are losing their lands either to drought or to unprecedented  
98 flooding have a carbon footprint that is 1/200th the carbon footprint of the average American;

99

100 WHEREAS, the people and institutions who actually caused and are causing climate change aren't  
101 being held accountable for the catastrophic damage climate change is already causing;

102

103 WHEREAS, the Green New Deal acknowledges the necessity of assuming moral responsibility for  
104 intergenerational harm caused by failure to act on climate change and the urgency of taking action on a  
105 comprehensive scale to reduce the catastrophe future generations will inherit;

106

107 WHEREAS, on March 15, 2019, more than 1,400,000 young people in 128 countries, in over 2,200  
108 cities and towns, and on every continent (including Antarctica) walked out of their schools on a school  
109 strike for climate action – the biggest day of global climate action ever – insisting that, in the words of  
110 16-year old Greta Thunberg, initiator of the school strike for the climate and Nobel Prize nominee, “We  
111 need a whole new way of thinking...we need to start cooperating and sharing the remaining resources of  
112 this planet in a fair way”;<sup>11</sup>

114 WHEREAS, in 2017, 97% of Synod delegates acknowledged the profound moral implications of  
115 climate change by voting to “declare a new moral era,” and committing to the “moral imperative” of  
116 urging “clergy to speak from their pulpits about the moral obligation of our generation to protect God’s  
117 creation”;

118

119 WHEREAS, the two interfaith environmental organizations with which the United Church of Christ  
120 partners - [Interfaith Power and Light](#) (a national organization with affiliates in almost every state) and  
121 [Greenfaith](#) - describe the Green New Deal as “a tangible expression of key values that animate [our]  
122 vision of a better world” and as “a profound moral opportunity” because the Green New Deal is  
123 informed by truth and science, driven by urgency, far reaching in its scale and comprehensive in its  
124 goals;<sup>12</sup>

125

126 WHEREAS, Yale researchers say 81% of the voters they polled support a Green New Deal to create  
127 jobs and work toward renewable energy;<sup>12</sup>

128

129 WHEREAS, scores of scientists have spoken out in favor of the Green New Deal, including Stanford  
130 Professor Mark Jacobson, whose research demonstrates that each of the 50 states can establish a zero-  
131 emissions economy by 2035 and who says, "Right now, we have about ninety per cent or ninety-five per  
132 cent of the technology we need.... We don't need a technological miracle to solve this problem. The  
133 bottom line is we just need to deploy, deploy, deploy";<sup>13</sup>

135 WHEREAS, on February 8, 2019, [the executive leadership of the United Church of Christ endorsed the](#)  
136 [Green New Deal](#);<sup>14</sup>

137

138 WHEREAS, over the past 50+ years the UCC, along with religious leaders from other faiths and  
139 denominations, has issued countless statements on the goodness of Creation and our call to act as  
140 responsible environmental stewards, all of which has been an insufficient witness;

141

142 WHEREAS, the Core Purpose of the United Church of Christ states (in part): "... we serve God in the  
143 co-creation of a just and sustainable world as made manifest in the Gospel of Jesus Christ"; and

144

145 WHEREAS, this historic moment provides Christian communities with a powerful opportunity to bear  
146 witness to the sacredness of God's Creation and the urgent call to preserve it, and responding to this call  
147 expresses the new mission initiative of the UCC known as [the three great loves](#), one of which is love of  
148 creation;

149

150 **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Thirty-second General Synod of the United Church of  
151 Christ, in keeping with numerous resolutions passed by previous General Synods, recognizes the scale  
152 and immediacy of the climate crisis, the urgent need to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas emissions as  
153 soon as possible, and the moral obligation to embrace the unprecedented socio-economic changes that  
154 we must effect and engage **as opportunities** to create fair paying jobs, secure clean air and water,  
155 redress manifestations of environmental racism and pursue a just transition to clean and renewable  
156 energy.

157

158 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Thirty-second General Synod of the United Church of Christ  
159 joins [the executive leadership of the United Church of Christ](#)<sup>15</sup> and the United Church of Christ Council

160 for Climate Justice (with representatives from all geographic conferences of the UCC) in endorsing [the](#)  
161 [Green New Deal Resolution](#)<sup>16</sup> (H. Res. 109) released by Congress on February 7, 2019.

162

163 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Thirty-second General Synod of the United Church of Christ  
164 calls upon the whole of the church to accept the moral responsibility that comes with living “at such a  
165 time as this” (Esther 4:14) by:

- 166 • Standing up for the critical role science must play in understanding the challenges that now pose  
167 an existential threat to life as we have known it on this planet;
- 168 • Continuing to learn from scientifically informed sources about the new realities and new  
169 solutions that are emerging every day;
- 170 • Discussing climate change with increasing frequency at church, at home, at work and in our  
171 social encounters, emphasizing how it threatens things we all value while noting that we already  
172 have all the technology we need<sup>17</sup> to achieve the goals of the Green New Deal;
- 173 • Incorporating into our worship life and community leadership an awareness of climate change,  
174 its consequences (especially for vulnerable, frontline communities), and the opportunities we still  
175 have to make the changes science says we must and technology says we can;
- 176 • Helping our communities to be more prepared for extreme weather events and more resilient to a  
177 changing climate in the long term;
- 178 • Lifting up the reality that most people, regardless of their political affiliation or allegiance,  
179 support the Green New Deal because it addresses not only climate change but also numerous  
180 forms of injustice;

- 181 • Paying attention as federal, state and local agencies develop and propose new policies that  
182 impact our environment and engaging those agencies as advocates for policies and legislation  
183 that advance the goals of the Green New Deal, including its commitment to address the  
184 “systemic injustices” that disproportionately affect “frontline and vulnerable communities”;
- 185 • Maintaining a commitment to compassion and fairness by advocating for a just transition for  
186 those workers and communities most dependent on fossil fuel energy so that they, too, have  
187 opportunities for clean, healthful and family-supporting jobs that heal our planet.

188 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Thirty-second General Synod of the United Church of Christ  
189 calls upon the whole of the church to accept that it is up to us to pour ourselves out to bend the moral arc  
190 of the universe towards justice, with joy in our hearts, beauty in our sights, and hope for the children.

193 **FUNDING**

194 Funding for the implementation of this Resolution will be made in accordance with the overall mandates  
195 of the affected agencies and the funds available.

197 **IMPLEMENTATION**

198 The Officers of the Church, in consultation with appropriate ministries or other entities within the  
199 United Church of Christ, will determine the implementing body.
